#### **1. INTRODUCTION**

- 1.1. Prospectus for admission to **Four year Under Graduate Degree Programme under Choice Based Credit and Semester System (CBCSS)** at Government/Aided/Self Financing Affiliated Colleges for the academic year 2026-27 as approved by the University is published. It contains general information and rules relating to the admissions to these programmes.
- 1.2. The conduct of the University FYUG programmes shall be governed by the regulations in force with effect from 2024 admission
- 1.3. Admissions to the seats to be filled by the University for the **Four year** Under Graduate Degree Programmes (except those specifically mentioned) are regulated on the basis of the marks/grade points obtained in the qualifying examination. The details of seats to which admissions are made through the rank list prepared accordingly are contained in the relevant paragraphs. (Clause 4.1).
- 1.4. As per Kannur University First statutes 1998, '*no student shall be admitted to any course of instruction in the Colleges in anticipation of Affiliation*'.
- 1.5. The prospectus is subject to modification/addition/deletion as may be deemed fit by the University. The applicants are requested to visit the website [www.admissions.kannuruniversity.ac.in](http://www.admissions.kannuruniversity.ac.in) for Notification and Announcements.

#### **2. GENERAL INFORMATION**

Admission to Four year UG Degree Programme (with 3<sup>rd</sup> year exit option) under Choice Based Credit and Semester system (CBCSS at Arts and Science Colleges affiliated to Kannur University will be made on the basis of Centralized Allotment Process (CAP).

Online allotment process will provide candidates with an opportunity for obtaining admission to any of the Colleges/Programmes of University of his/her choice on the basis of merit.

**Any candidate who desires to obtain admission under the Kannur University for the Degree programme should compulsorily register through online before the closure of registration, irrespective of the Category (General /SEBC/ EWS/ SC/ST/ Community /Management / Candidates from Union Territory of Lakshadweep/Jammu and Kashmir/Persons With Benchmark Disabilities/ widows /wards of Armed Forces Personnel, killed or disabled in action or during peace time/ Sports etc.) to which he/she belongs.**

The allotment of candidates to various Programmes and Colleges will be on the basis of merit strictly following the rules and regulations regarding reservation. The marks at Higher Secondary level would be the basic criteria for admission to Degree Programmes. **The students who seek admission in Sports/Community/Management Quota should register through online and submit a copy of the print out to the colleges concerned with a request.**

*Candidates seeking admission on passing SAY examination during the current Academic year can register online before the supplementary allotment. They will be considered for the supplementary allotment.*

## **2.1 Authority to prescribe qualification for admission to the various programmes.**

As per Sub-Section (v) and (vi) of Section 27 of the Kannur University Act, 1996, the Academic Council shall have the power to prescribe qualifications for admission of students to the various programmes (and to the Examinations) and the conditions under which exemptions shall be granted, and to make provision for the admission of students to the various courses of studies on the basis of merit in order to maintain standard of education.

## **2.2 Agreement for Direct Payment - Relevant provisions for admission to the various programmes in aided colleges.**

Article 18 of the Agreement for Direct Payment entered into between the Government and The Educational Agencies of Private Colleges stipulates that all future admission of Students to the private affiliated colleges shall be on the following basis:

- a) Twenty percent of the total number of seats in each college shall be reserved for students belonging to the Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes. Those seats that cannot be filled on this basis shall be filled on the basis of merit from among backward minority communities, in the case of colleges run by backward minority communities and by OEC, in all other cases.
- b) \*Ten/\*\*Twenty percent of the seats shall be reserved for the candidates belonging to the community to which the college belongs. These seats will be filled strictly on the basis of merit from among the students of the said community.
- c) \*Fifty/\*\*Forty percent of the seats will be filled by open selection on the basis of merit.
- d) The remaining seats will be filled by the Educational Agency by candidates of their choice.

*Note: \* This will apply to colleges run by educational agencies belonging to Forward Community Colleges*

*\*\*This will apply to colleges run by educational agencies belonging Backward Community Colleges*

## **2.3 Age limit: There is no upper age limit.**

## **3. PROGRAMMES, INSTITUTIONS AND SEATS**

**3.1. Details of the Programme and Duration:** The implementation of Four-Year Undergraduate Programme (FYUGP) has been driven by the pressing need to address contemporary challenges ensuring responsive changes to the evolving needs of students, industry, and society at large. The features, meaning, and purpose of FYUGP shall be as stipulated by the UGC and as adapted by the Kerala State Undergraduate Curriculum Framework (KSUCF).

Kannur University Four Year Undergraduate Programme (KU-FYUGP) shall have three Broad Pathways, **(a) 3 year UG Degree, (b) 4 year UG Degree (Honours), and (c) 4 year UG Degree (Honours with Research)**

### **(a) 3 year UG Degree**

Students who choose to exit after 3 years shall be awarded a UG Degree in their respective Major Discipline after the successful completion of the required minimum of Courses of 133 credits (133).

### **(b) 4 year UG Degree (Honours with Research)**

Four year UG (Honours with Research) Degree in the Major Discipline shall be awarded to those who complete the KU-FYUGP with a specific number of Courses of 177 credits including 12 credits from a graduate project /dissertation in their major discipline.

### **(c) 4 year UG Degree (Honours)**

Four year UG Honours Degree in the Discipline/ Disciplines shall be awarded to those who complete the KU-FYUGP with a specific number of Courses with 177 credits including an optional graduate project/ dissertation of 8 credits in their major discipline.

#### **Duration of Programmes, Credits requirements and options**

- a) Students will be offered the opportunity to take breaks during the programme and resume after the break, but the total duration for completing the programme **shall not exceed 8 years**.
- b) Candidates who wish to complete the undergraduate programmes faster may do so by completing different courses equivalent to the required number of credits and fulfilling all other requirements in N-1 semesters (where N is the number of semesters in an undergraduate programme).
- c) Candidates may complete both the undergraduate programmes in slower pace, they may pursue the three years or six semester programmes in 4 to 5 years (8 to 10 semesters), and four years, or eight semester programmes in 5 to 6 years (10 to 12 semesters).
- d) For students who crossed 6 semesters at a slower pace, the requirement of 16 credits from the institutions where they enrolled may be relaxed. The higher education institutions shall admit candidates not only for programmes, but also for subjects or courses

**3.2. Institutions and Programmes for the UG Degree Programme:** The list of Colleges affiliated to Kannur University and the subjects offered in each institution are given as **Annexure I**.

**3.3. Categorization of Seats:** Seats available in Affiliated Colleges are mainly classified as Merit Seats, Community Seats, Management Seats and Reservation Seats.

- a). **Merit Seats:** The seats that are filled by the University in Government/Aided/Self Financing Affiliated Colleges purely on the basis of merit are classified as ‘Merit Seats’.
- a) **Community Seats:** The seats in Aided Colleges that are filled by the college concerned, from among the candidates who belong to the community of the Management that runs the college, on the basis of merit among their community candidates, are classified as Community seats.
- b) **Management Seats:** The seats in Aided/Self Financing Affiliated Colleges that are filled by the Managements concerned are classified as ‘Management Seats’.
- c) **Reservation Seats:** The seats in Government/Aided/Self Financing Affiliated Colleges, which are earmarked for SC/ST/SEBC/EWS/PWBD /Transgender persons/ Sports persons etc are classified as ‘Reservation Seats’.

#### **4. RESERVATION OF SEATS**

**A candidate can claim only one benefit as per her/his choice.**

**4.1 Types of Reservation:** Seats will be reserved for the following categories in Affiliated Colleges for various UG Programmes.

- 1)Mandatory Reservation.
- 2)Reservation for Persons with Benchmark Disability (PwBD)
- 3)Reservation for Transgender Persons
- 4) Reservation for Inmates of Govt. Children’s Home
- 5) Special Reservation
- 6) Reservation for Nominees

##### **4.1.1 Mandatory Reservation**

**a). Government Colleges**

**Note:** Students who seek admission in community quota should register through online and submit a copy of the printout to the colleges concerned with a request. The seats under community quota in Aided Colleges will be filled by the concerned Management on the basis of merit and on the basis of community certificate issued by the Revenue Authorities/Parish Priest/any other Competent Authority.

Applicants claiming admission under Community quota in Aided Colleges shall belong to the community of the Management which runs the college. They will have to produce any document to prove community/caste/non creamy layer certificate from village officer at the time of admission, to prove their claim.

***\*EWS reservation of 10% shall be additionally created over and above the total strength of seats for all programmes in all Aided Colleges which do not have minority status***

***Note: EWS reservation will be subject to orders issued by the Govt. from time to time.***

**Govt. Educational institutions/ Self-Financing Colleges:** In Govt .Educational Institutions , Self-financing colleges &Self-financing programmes conducted in Aided colleges, 50 % of the total seats shall be filled by the management from among candidates of their choice provided they satisfy the eligibility conditions. The remaining seats (50%) will be distributed and filled as detailed below:

**In cases where the number of applicants under the Community Quota and Management Quota in Aided / Self financing Colleges exceeds the number of seats allotted to the respective quotas, admission should be granted on the basis of priority determined by Index Marks.**

***\*EWS reservation of 10% shall be additionally created over and above the total strength of seats for all programmes in all institutions which do not have minority status***

***Note: EWS reservation will be subject to orders issued by the Govt. from time to time.***

#### **Mode of admission under Management Quota in Aided/Self Financing Colleges**

1. Candidates seeking admission to the Management quota seats in Aided/Self Financing colleges should register online.
2. There is no centralized allotment for seats ear marked under Management Quota. Candidates should contact the colleges where the candidate intends to take admission and submit the printout of the online registration application form to the colleges concerned.
3. After closure of registration for the centralized allotment process, registration exclusively for Management quota seats will be open. The candidates seeking admission under Management Quota alone can apply till the closure of admission.
4. It may be noted that the candidates who have submitted their online application through the Management Quota link will not be considered for the allotment process.
5. **If a candidate has already registered for centralized allotment process, it is sufficient for admission under Management Quota also. There is no need of separate registration under Management Quota.**

#### **CLAIMS FOR MANDATORY RESERVATION AND CERTIFICATES TO BE PRODUCED**

- (i) Claims for Mandatory Reservations must be made by a candidate at the time of submission of online application. Candidates should mention their claim in the **relevant columns** in the

Personal and Academic Data Sheet. They should also satisfy the eligibility conditions as per the Prospectus, at the time of online registration.

- (ii) Candidates should produce all original documents to prove their claims made in the online application form, at the time of admission, before the Principal. **The claims that are not mentioned at the time of online submission of application will not be entertained even if supporting evidences are produced later on. The claims for mandatory reservation, once made, cannot be altered under any circumstances.**
- (iii) Only candidates belonging to “Keralite” category, are eligible for claiming seats under Mandatory and Special reservation quota unless otherwise specified in the Prospectus.

**Claim for Community reservation under ‘Socially and Educationally Backward Classes’ (SEBC):**

Reservation of seats to the Socially and Educationally backward Classes will be in accordance with the provisions contained in G.O. (P) 208/66/Edn. dated 2.5.1966, as amended from time to time.

(a) As per G.O. (Ms) No.02/2017, Backward Community Development, dated 08/03/2017, candidates belonging to Socially and Educationally Backward Classes under NON CREAMY LAYER category are eligible for reservation under this category. Non creamy layer certificate is obtained from Village officer concerned. *The validity of the non-creamy layer certificate is one year.*

The candidates belonging to the Communities included in the SEBC list (as detailed in **Annexure II(d)**) alone will be eligible for the benefit of reservation under this category.

**Claim for Reservation under Scheduled Castes/Scheduled Tribes quota (SC/ST)**

- (a) Candidates claiming reservation under Scheduled Castes/ Scheduled Tribes quota should obtain the caste/community certificate from the Village Officer / Tahsildar. Candidates belonging to SC/ST communities allotted against merit seats or against the seats reserved for them are exempted from payment of fee at the time of admission. *The validity of the SC/ST certificate is three year.*
- (SC/ST list is given in Annexure II (a) & II (b))

**The seats unavailed by the SC candidates will go to ST candidates and vice versa.**

***Warning: Those who produce false Certificate for claiming reservation shall be liable for punishment as per rules.***

**(b) Claim of OEC candidates against the un-availed seats of SC/ST candidates:**

Other Eligible Community (OEC) candidates are eligible for un-availed seats, if any, under SC/ST quota. **The communities listed in the Annexure(II(c)) only are eligible for such un-availed seats, if any , under SC/ST quota.**(G.O.(Ms)No.14/2017/BCDD dated 02.08.2017).The candidate should furnish any document to prove their community and non-creamy layer certificate obtained from the Village Officer/ Tahsildar concerned, at the time admission.

**Converted Christians do not come under the SC/ST category. They belong to OEC category.**

**(c) Claim for fee concession to OEC candidates:**

Candidates belonging to Other Eligible Communities are exempted from payment of fee at the time of admission to UG Degree Programme under Government/Community quota irrespective of annual family income as per G.O (MS) No. 36/07/SCSTDD, dated: 03.07.2007. They should produce any document to prove their community.(the communities listed in the **Annexure II(c)**)

**(d) Claim for fee concession to the candidates who get OEC educational assistance:**

As per the G.O.(Ms) 10/2014/BCDD dated 23.05.2014, 30 communities from state OBC list are selected for OEC educational assistance subject to a maximum of Rs. 6 Lakh annual income. (G.O (MS) No.03/2018/BCDD) dated 09.04.2018 (Communities listed in **Annexure II(e)**).They should provide any document to prove their community and Income Certificates from the Village Officer at the time of admission. (The validity of income certificate of OEC community is one year.)

#### **Claims for Reservation under Economically Weaker Sections (EWS) in General Category**

Candidates who enjoy Communal Reservation such as SEBC, SC/ST are NOT eligible for EWS reservation. **Only the candidates belonging to Economically weaker section which does not belong to SC/ST or other backward classes as per reservation rule are eligible for EWS reservation.** Communities who are economically backward are eligible for EWS Reservation. Such candidates must produce either of the certificates from the Village Officer namely “The applicant belonging to Anthyodaya Anna Yojana (AAY) and Priority House Hold (PHH) category”- (Annexure IV) or “The Income and Assets certificate for Economically Weaker Sections (EWS) in General Category (**Annexure V**).

#### **OTHER GENERAL RULES FOR MANDATORY RESERVATION**

##### **General Rules for conversion of vacant seats**

- The seats un-availed by the SC candidates will go to ST candidate and vice versa. If sufficient candidates are not available for filling the seats reserved for SC/ST candidates, the same will be notified in the media and a separate allotment for SC/ST candidates will be made by the University. However, even after this, if SC/ST seats remains vacant such seats shall be filled as detailed below.

##### **Government/Aided/Self Financing Colleges except Colleges run by Backward Minority Communities:**

The unfilled seats shall be filled up from the candidates belonging to OEC(Annexure II(c)), and in their absence candidates belonging to SEBC.

If sufficient candidates are not available for filling the seats reserved for SEBC, the seats that remain unfilled will be converted to the General Merit Quota.

**Aided Colleges run by Backward Minority Communities:** The unfilled seats shall be filled on the basis of the merit as per the rank list from among the applicants of backward minority community, which runs the college. If seats still remain unfilled, it will be filled up from candidates belonging to OEC (Annexure II(c)) and in their absence, candidates belonging to SEBC. The seats that further remain unfilled will go to the open quota.

- If out of the 20% seats reserved to the SEBC category (*Ezhava/Thiyya/Bilava (EZ) - 8%, Muslims (MU) - 7%, Latin Catholic - 1%, Other Backward Christian (BX) - 1%, Other Backward Hindu (BH) - 3%*), if there is no candidate available from one of the five categories within the SEBC category, the said seats will be given to eligible candidates from other categories belonging to the SEBC category (considering merit).

##### **4.1.2 Reservation for Persons with Benchmark Disability (PwBD):**

- (i) 5% of the total seats, over and above the sanctioned strength will be set apart exclusively for persons with benchmark disabilities in each programme.

As per Clause 2(r), Chapter I of The Rights of Persons with Disabilities Act, 2016, ‘Person with benchmark disability’ means a person suffering from not less than 40% of a specified disability where specified disability has not been defined in measurable terms and includes a person with disability where specified disability has been defined in measurable terms, as

certified by the certifying authority. Candidates seeking admission under PWBD category should submit the 'Certificate of disability' (permanent), by the District Medical Board or bodies of higher status, certifying the degree of percentage of disability. Based on the details furnished in the online application, candidates will be provisionally included under the 'Persons with Benchmark Disability' category.

(ii) Maximum of three seats have been reserved in Govt./aided Colleges for the admission of candidates with autism/ intellectual disability/ specific learning disability/ mental illness(considering all these four categories as one unit) by creating additional seats over and above the sanctioned strength in each programmes

Note: The selection of candidates under this category will be based on the rank in the inter-merit list and physical suitability and not on the basis of the degree of disability.

#### **4.1.3 Reservation for Transgender Persons**

Two seats shall be created over and above the sanctioned strength in all programmes in affiliated Arts & Science Colleges exclusively for admitting Transgender students. (G.O.(Ms)No.153/2018 HEdn dated 03.07.2018). Such candidates should submit transgender identity card issued by the State Government at the time of admission. (G.O. (Ms.) No. 295/2021/HEDN dated 07/07/2021).

#### **4.1.4 Reservation for Govt. Children's Home Inmates**

One seat shall be created over and above the sanctioned strength in all Govt. and Aided Colleges exclusively for admitting inmates of government children's homes operating under the Department of Social Justice and institutions operating under the Juvenile Justice Act. (G.O. No.೧೨.೭. (೧೨೨.೨)೧೦.2484/2012/೭.೧೩.೧೩ dated 20.12.2012 and U.O.No.SWC/SWC II/18054/2021 dated 13.01.2025)

#### **4.1.5 SPECIAL RESERVATION**

##### **Sports Quota :**

- i. Two seats in each U.G. Programme will be reserved for candidates with records in sports and games. The seats will be allotted by **creating additional seats over and above** the sanctioned strength. If eligible sports persons are not available the unfilled seats should be kept vacant.
- ii. **The Sports Quota candidates should also register through online before the closure of registration date. The student should submit printout of the application (along with copies of sports certificates) to the Principal of the concerned college with a request. The Principal thereafter, with the help of Physical Education Department of the college will prepare a rank list as per the University norms. The rank list should be published in the college notice board for student's redressal for a minimum of three days for the final publication of the rank list.**

*If vacancies arise due to discontinuation of candidates under Sports quota, the next eligible candidate in the Rank List (Sports quota) shall be admitted. In case there is no eligible candidate, the unfilled seat shall be kept vacant.*

- iii. Additional seats for outstanding sportspersons :  
Criteria for sanctioning additional seats for outstanding sportspersons for UG admission
  - a) Additional seats shall be sanctioned within the statutory limit.
  - b) The recommendation for the same from the concerned college Principal shall be verified and recommended by the Director of Physical Education, Kannur University

**Norms for admission under Sports Quota will be issued separately.**

#### 4.1.6. Reservation for Nominees

i) **Reservation for Candidates from Union Territory of Lakshadweep** : An additional seat shall be created for each UG Degree Programme (wherever necessary) in all Affiliated Colleges, exclusively for the purpose of accommodating students sponsored by the Authorities of Union Territory of Lakshadweep. This seat shall not be filled up by other candidates.

ii) **Concession for Wards of Kashmiri Migrants and Kashmiri Pandit/ Kashmiri Hindu families (Non-migrants) living in Kashmir valley** : The following relevant concessions are applicable for wards of Kashmiri Migrants and Kashmiri Pandit/ Kashmiri Hindu families (Non-migrants) living in Kashmir valley for admission to the UG programmes in all Affiliated Arts & Science Colleges.

- Relaxation in cut off percentage up to 10% subject to minimum eligibility requirement.
- Increase in intake capacity up to 5% programme wise.
- Waiving of domicile requirements for Kashmiri Migrants only. Kashmiri Pandits / Kashmiri Hindu families (Non-migrants) living in the Kashmir valley need domicile certificate.

iii) **Reservation for Candidates from Jammu and Kashmir**: Two seats shall be created over and above the sanctioned strength to accommodate candidates belonging to Jammu & Kashmir for admission to UG programmes in the Affiliated Colleges.

iv). **Reservation for Native students of Union Territory of Andaman and Nicobar Islands**: An additional seat shall be created over and above the sanctioned strength for each UG Degree Programme (wherever necessary) in all Affiliated Colleges, for the admission of native students from Union Territory of Andaman and Nicobar Islands. This seat shall not be filled up by other candidates.

v) **Reservation for Kannada Linguistic Minority (KLM)** : 5% seats have been reserved for the students belonging to the following Linguistic Minority group in Govt. Colleges as detailed below as per order no. G.O. (Ms.) No. 148/96/H.Edn. dated 1st August 1996. The seats will be additionally created over and above the sanctioned seats in all programmes

1. Government college, Manjeswaram –Kannada Linguistic Minority
2. Government college, Kasaragod – Kannada Linguistic Minority

If there is no eligible candidate for the admission to KLM reservation, the unfilled seats shall be kept vacant.

vi) **Reservation for Urdu Linguistic Minority (ULM)**: 2% seats have been reserved for the students belonging to Urdu Linguistic Minority group in Govt. Colleges as detailed below as per order no. G.O. (Ms.) No. 167/67/Edn.dated 15/04/1967.

The seats will be additionally created over and above the sanctioned seats in all programmes.

1. Government Brennen College, Thalassery.

In the absence of those who have studied Urdu as second language in higher secondary, those who have studied Urdu in SSLC will be considered for admission. If there is no eligible candidate for admission to ULM reservation, the unfilled seats shall be kept vacant.

vii) **Reservation of seats for the widows/wards of Armed Forces of Personnel, killed/disabled in action or during peace time** : Additional seats over and above the sanctioned strength may be created as and when required for the widows /wards of Armed Forces Personnel from Army, Navy, Airforce killed or disabled in action or during peace time. Paramilitary forces/CAPF/GREF/Coast Guard etc. will not be considered under this category. Priority level is as given below.

**5. RULES FOR ADMISSION OF STUDENTS TO VARIOUS UG DEGREE PROGRAMMES IN AFFILIATED COLLEGES**

**5.1. Assessment of Merit:** Except when otherwise provided, the merit of a candidate will be assessed on the basis of the marks obtained by the candidate in the qualifying examinations for admission to the particular programmes, subject to such criteria as may be prescribed by the University. In assessing merit, marks will be awarded for extracurricular activities like sports, NCC, NSS, SPC etc. of the students. These marks will be added to the marks obtained for the qualifying examination for preparing the rank list.

**5.1.1. Weightage:-**

**1. Candidates who have attended NSS/NCC/SPC/ during the period of the qualifying examinations ie, Higher Secondary only will be eligible for the bonus mark. The Certificate issued by the Director of NSS/NCC only will be considered for bonus mark in respect of NSS/NCC candidates.**

**2. Candidates who got [Rajyamudra/ Nanmamudra](#) certificate in Scouts/ Guides/ Ranger/ Rower in higher secondary level are eligible for bonus marks of 15.**

**Note:**

- a) In respect of NCC applicants, the bonus marks will be awarded, on the basis of N.C.C. Certificates signed by the Director and issued by the Directorate of N.C.C., to the candidates who have secured at least 75% of attendance after having participated in its activities during the course of study immediately preceding the Programme for which admission is sought.
- b) For awarding bonus marks to N.S.S. Participants, the basis will be N.S.S. Certificates signed by the Competent Authority.
- c) For awarding bonus mark to SPC, the certificate signed by the Competent Authority shall be submitted.
- d) The benefit of bonus marks (15 marks) for purposes of admission can be earned by the candidates only under any one category (N.S.S./N.C.C./S.P.C./Scouts/ Guides/ Ranger/ Rower). An additional weightage of 5or 10 marks will be awarded to NCC cadets holding B or C Certificates respectively.
- e) The weightage of bonus marks shall be added to the marks scored by the candidate either to make him/her eligible for admission to a Programme or for ranking purposes to those who are otherwise eligible for admission. In the case of candidates who get the eligibility by this bonus marks, their ranking mark will be the sum of scored marks and the bonus marks.

**f) Ex-Servicemen & their dependants**

A weightage of 15 marks will be given to the ex-servicemen and widows and children of Jawans and Ex-servicemen for admission(Applicable to Army/Navy/Airforce only. Not applicable to paramilitary forces/CAPF/GREF/Coast Guard etc.). Certificates in proof of claim with supporting documents to be produced at the time of admission.

**5.1.2. The Candidates who have passed qualifying exam under CISCE or any other boards which have more than three electives will have to submit more than one application with different electives, in case they wish to seek admission for all the electives they have studied.**

**For example: a candidate who chooses Mathematics as elective should compulsorily enter the marks of Mathematics plus the marks of any other two electives as per their choice of that stream. This is applicable for all other subjects. Such candidates will have to submit separate applications with separate registration fee.**

**6. ELIGIBILITY FOR ADMISSION**

**6.1. Notwithstanding anything contained in the Statutes, the selection of students in Government colleges shall be governed by the rules prescribed by the Government from time to time with the concurrence of the University in respect of such admissions.**

“A pass in Higher Secondary Examination/Vocational Higher Secondary Examination of the Government of Kerala or an Examination accepted by the Academic Council of the university as equivalent thereto”.

*N.B. For subjects which are not being offered at the qualifying Examination level, the marks of related subject or subjects, knowledge of which is essential for the study of the subject proposed to be chosen for the UG Degree Programme, shall be added to the total marks for the purpose of ranking.*

**7.1 Standardization of marks for admission to UG Degree Programme under CBCS system – Guidelines issued (2010-2011 onwards).**

a). In the case of Higher Secondary Examination from 2010 onwards, the index marks are to be calculated as follows.

Total marks secured for Higher Secondary + Marks secured in the concerned subject

For e.g. If the student has secured 800 marks out of the total 1200 marks and if he has secured 150 out of 200 in mathematics, his index marks will be  $800 + 150 = 950$ .

In the case of admission to B.A English, the marks obtained for English is doubled and added to the total mark. If the student in the above example has secured 120 marks out of 200 in English, his index mark will be  $800 + 240 = 1040$

b). In the case of VHSE students from 2021 onwards, the index marks are to be calculated as follows

Total marks secured for VHSE [English +Entrepreneurship Development+ Vocational Theory(out of 200) +3 optionals] + Marks secured in the concerned subject

For e.g. If the student has secured 800 marks out of the total 1200 marks and if he has secured 150 out of 200 in mathematics, his index marks will be  $800 + 150 = 950$ .

In the case of admission to U.G. Degree Programme in English (if scored 150 marks out of 200 in English) Index marks =  $800 + 300 = 1100$ .

c). In the case of other Boards such as CBSE and CISCE, normalize the total marks to 1200 and then add TWICE THE PERCENTAGE of marks obtained in the concerned subject.

For Example: If a student has secured 400 out of the total of 500 marks in the CBSE stream and if he has say, secured 80 marks out of 100 in mathematics, his index marks will be  $400/500 \times 1200$  plus 160 (i.e,  $80 \times 2$ ) marks of mathematics. That is  $960 + 160 = 1120$ . In the case of admission to UG Degree Programme in English, quadruple(4 times) the marks obtained for English and add to the normalized total marks.

For eg: If the student in example above secured 70 out of 100 marks in English, then his index mark will be

$960 + 280 = 1240$

## 7.2. Weightage of marks for N.C.C. /N.S.S. /S.P.C./Scouts/ Guides/Ranger/ Rower(Nanmamudra/ Rajyamudra certificates) Certificate holders/Ex-servicemen/ Dependents of Ex-service Men and Jawans

Bonus marks in respect of N.C.C., N.S.S., S.P.C. and Scouts/Guides/Ranger/ Rower (Nanmamudra/ Rajyamudra certificates) candidates will be given for the purpose of ranking in the manner given below:

The benefit of bonus marks (15 marks) for purposes of admission can be earned by the candidates only under any one category (either N.S.S. or N.C.C. or S.P.C. or Scouts/ Guides/ Ranger/ Rower (Nanmamudra/ Rajyamudra certificates)). An additional Weightage of 5, 10 marks will be awarded to NCC cadets holding B, C Certificates respectively will be given for the purpose of ranking: see the clause 5.1.1

**Weightage of 10 marks shall be awarded as bonus marks to the applicants of Government & Aided colleges belonging to the district in which the college is situated.**

**Weightage of 10 marks to the applicants of UG Programme in unaided colleges at Taluk level**

**Weightage of 20 marks to the ST applicants of Wayanad district for admission in Arts& Science colleges of Wayanad District under the Jurisdiction of Kannur University as per order No. Acad./D2/2805/2017 dated 20/04/2017.**

## 7.3 Resolving of tie:

In the case of a tie of index marks, the following will be considered on a priority basis

- Marks of the subject opted
- Marks of English
- Date of Birth (older be placed higher in ranking)

#### 7.4 Deductions /Loosing of marks for subsequent appearances

Candidates will lose 10 marks for ranking purpose for every successive attempt after the first attempt of qualifying examination, subject to a maximum of 25 marks. The number of chances means the number of chances taken for passing any part of the qualifying examination. Betterment of examination will not be considered as a chance.

## 13. MORE ABOUT KANNUR UNIVERSITY FYUG PROGRAMME

**KU-FYUG programme is a Four year Undergraduate Honours Degree programme with exit option at third year, have three Broad Pathways,**

**(a) 3 year UG Degree, (b) 4 year UG Degree (Honours), and (c) 4 year UG Degree (Honours with Research).**

- Students who choose to exit after 3 years shall be awarded a UG Degree in their respective Major Discipline after the successful completion of the required minimum of Courses of 133 credits (133).
- A four-year UG Honours Degree with Research in the Major Discipline shall be awarded to those who complete the KU-FYUGP with a specific number of Courses of 177 credits including 12 credits from a graduate project /dissertation in their major discipline. Students who aspire to pursue research as a career may opt for Honours with a research stream in the fourth year.
- A 4-year UG Honours Degree in the Discipline/ Disciplines shall be awarded to those who complete the KU-FYUGP with a specific number of Courses with 177 credits including an optional graduate project/ dissertation of 8 credits in their major discipline.
- The recognized research departments/ departments with at least two faculty with

- PhD may be permitted to offer the honours with research program
- The number of seats for the Honours with research shall be determined as per the availability of eligible faculty.
  - The selection criteria for Honours with research stream shall be in accordance with the guidelines of UGC or as approved by Kannur University
  - Students who have chosen the honours with research stream shall be mentored by a faculty with a PhD.
  - The mentor shall prescribe suitable advanced-level courses for a minimum of 20 credits to be taken within the institutions along with the papers on research methodology, research ethics, and research topic-specific courses for a minimum of 12 credits which may be obtained either within the institution or from other recognized institutions, including online and blended modes.
  - These students who have opted for the honours with research should complete a research project under the guidance of the mentor and should submit a research report for evaluation. They need to successfully defend the research project to obtain 12 credits under a faculty member of the University/College. The research shall be in the Major/allied discipline.
  - The research outcomes of their project work may be published in peer reviewed journals or presented at conferences or seminars or patented.
  - The proposed KU-FYUGP curriculum shall comprise Three Broad Parts:  
a) Foundation Components, b) Discipline Specific Pathway components (Major/Minor), and c) Discipline Specific Capstone Components.
  - The Foundation component of the KU-FYUGP shall consist of a set of general courses and a set of discipline-specific courses.
  - General Foundation Courses shall be common for all students and shall be:  
.Grouped into 4 major baskets as Ability Enhancement courses (AEC), Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC), Value Addition Courses (VAC), and Multi-disciplinary Courses (MDC).
  - Discipline-Specific Courses shall include Discipline-Specific Pathway Courses, both Major and Minor streams, enabling students to gain basic knowledge in the chosen discipline.

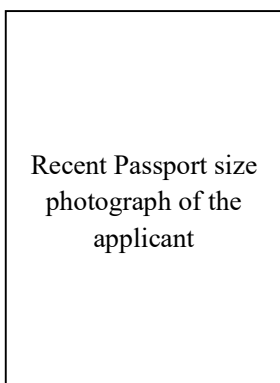
